Robert A. Caro is an award-winning biographer most noted for his studies of United States political figures Robert Moses and Lyndon B. Johnson. After working years as a reporter Caro wrote The Power Broker (1974), a biography of New York urban planner Robert Moses. Then he began the biographical series of the U.S. President

Lyndon B. Johnson, known as The Years of Lyndon Johnson (1982, 1990, 2002). Caro is a two-time Pulitzer Prize winner.



Jan Jarboe Russell, journalist and biographer, is the author of Lady Bird: A Biography of Mrs. Johnson, which has won favorable reviews by the *Washington Post*, *Kirkus*, all of the major newspapers in Texas, and many others around the country. She is also a syndicated opinion columnist with King Features (her column appears in the San Antonio Express-News, the Seattle Post-Intelligencer, the San Francisco Examiner, among others) and a writer-at-large for Texas Monthly. She lives in San Antonio with her husband and two children.
